# WADA out of-competition testing

In 2014, WADA conducted out-of-competition testing in IPC Athletics: three blood tests and four urine tests; and IPC Powerlifting: four blood tests and 14 urine tests.

# IPC Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) management

In total, IPC approved four TUEs for athletes that were either competing at the Sochi 2014 Paralympic Winter Games or at the 2014 IPC Shooting World Championships Suhl.

Breakdown by sport: IPC Alpine - 1; IPC Para-Snowboard – 1; IPC Shooting – 1; IPC Ice Sledge Hockey – 1.
